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RESOLUTION 2024-11 [FY 2025 APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION]

THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION RESOLUTION OF THE DEERING PARK STEWARDSHIP DISTRICT ("DISTRICT") RELATING TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS AND ADOPTING THE BUDGET(S) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2024, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("FY 2025"), the District Manager prepared and submitted to the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the Deering Park Stewardship District ("District") prior to July 15, 2024, proposed budget(s) ("Proposed Budget") along with an explanatory and complete financial plan for each fund of the District, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 2020-197, Laws of Florida, and Chapter 189, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, at least sixty (60) days prior to the adoption of the Proposed Budget, the District filed a copy of the Proposed Budget with the local general-purpose government(s) having jurisdiction over the area included in the District pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 2020-197, *Laws of Florida* and Chapter 189, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the Board set a public hearing on the Proposed Budget and caused notice of such public hearing to be given by publication pursuant to Chapter 2020-197, *Laws of Florida*, and Chapter 189, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, the District Manager posted the Proposed Budget on the District's website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2020-197, Laws of Florida, and Chapter 189, Florida Statutes, require that, prior to October 1st of each year, the Board, by passage of the Annual Appropriation Resolution, shall adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and appropriate such sums of money as the Board deems necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during the ensuing fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE DEERING PARK STEWARDSHIP DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. BUDGET

a. The Proposed Budget, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**, as amended by the Board, is hereby adopted in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2020-197, *Laws of Florida* and Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes* ("**Adopted Budget**"), and incorporated herein by reference; provided, however, that the comparative

figures contained in the Adopted Budget may be subsequently revised as deemed necessary by the District Manager to reflect actual revenues and expenditures.

- b. The Adopted Budget, as amended, shall be maintained in the office of the District Manager and at the District's Local Records Office and identified as "The Budget for the Deering Park Stewardship District for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2025."
- c. The Adopted Budget shall be posted by the District Manager on the District's official website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes* and shall remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS

There is hereby appropriated out of the revenues of the District, for FY 2025, the sum(s) set forth in **Exhibit A** to be raised by the levy of assessments and/or otherwise, which sum is deemed by the Board to be necessary to defray all expenditures of the District during said budget year, to be divided and appropriated as set forth in **Exhibit A**.

SECTION 3. BUDGET AMENDMENTS

Pursuant to Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, the District at any time within FY 2025 or within 60 days following the end of the FY 2025 may amend its Adopted Budget for that fiscal year as follows:

- a. A line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund may be decreased or increased by motion of the Board recorded in the minutes, and approving the expenditure, if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase.
- b. The District Manager or Treasurer may approve an expenditure that would increase or decrease a line-item appropriation for expenditures within a fund if the total appropriations of the fund do not increase and if either (i) the aggregate change in the original appropriation item does not exceed the greater of \$15,000 or 15% of the original appropriation, or (ii) such expenditure is authorized by separate disbursement or spending resolution.
- c. Any other budget amendments shall be adopted by resolution and consistent with Florida law. The District Manager or Treasurer must ensure that any amendments to the budget under this paragraph c. are posted on the District's website in accordance with Section 189.016, *Florida Statutes*, and remain on the website for at least two (2) years.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption.

BUDGET FUNDING AGREEMENT FISCAL YEAR 2025

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective as of October 1, 2024, by and between:

Deering Park Stewardship District, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 2020-197, *Laws of Florida*, ("**District**"), and is located in Brevard and Volusia Counties, Florida, and

Swallowtail LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, and the owner and/or Landowner of property located within the boundaries of the District ("Landowner," and together with the District, the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 2020-197, *Laws of Florida*, the District was established for the purpose of planning, financing, constructing, operating and/or maintaining certain infrastructure, and is authorized to levy such taxes, special assessments, fees, and other charges as may be necessary in furtherance of the District's activities and services; and

WHEREAS, Landowner is presently the owner of the majority of the lands ("**Property**") within the District, which Property will benefit from the timely construction and acquisition of the District's facilities, activities, and services and from the continued operations of the District; and

WHEREAS, for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025 ("FY 2025"), the Board of Supervisors ("Board") of the District adopted its general fund budget ("Budget") attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the Budget may be amended from time to time in the sole discretion of the District; and

WHEREAS, the District has the option of levying non-ad valorem assessments on all lands within the District benefitting from the activities, operations and services set forth in the Budget, including the Property, or utilizing such other revenue sources as may be available to it; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of levying assessments on the Property, the Landowner is willing to provide such funds as are necessary to allow the District to proceed with its operations as described in the Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Landowner agrees that the activities, operations and services provide a special and peculiar benefit to the Property equal to or in excess of the costs reflected in the Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Landowner agreed to enter into this Agreement in lieu of having the District levy and collect any non-ad valorem assessments as authorized by law against the lands within the District, including the Property, for the activities, operations, and services set forth in the Budget; and

WHEREAS, Landowner and District agree such Budget funding obligation by the Landowner may be secured and collection enforced pursuant to the methods provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the parties, the receipt of which and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **FUNDING.** The Landowner agrees to make available to the District the monies ("**Funding Obligation**") necessary for the operation of the District as called for in the Budget attached hereto as **Exhibit A** within thirty (30) days of written request by the District. **Exhibit A** attached hereto may be amended from time to time pursuant to Florida law, subject to the Landowner's consent to such amendments to incorporate them herein; provided however, that amendments adopted by the Board at a duly noticed meeting shall have the effect of amending this Agreement without further action of the Parties. As a point of clarification, the District shall only request as part of the Funding Obligation that the Landowner fund the actual expenses of the District, and the Landowner is not required to fund the total general fund Budget in the event that actual expenses are less than the projected total general fund Budget, as may be amended as provided herein. The funds shall be placed in the District's general checking account. In the event the Landowner sells any of the Property during the term of this Agreement, the Landowner's rights and obligations under this Agreement shall remain the same.
- 2. **ACKNOWLEDGEMENT.** The District hereby finds, and the Landowner acknowledges and agrees, that the activities, operations and services set forth in the Budget provide a special and peculiar benefit to the Property, which benefit is initially allocated on an equal developable acreage basis. These payments are made by the Landowner in lieu of taxes, fees, or assessments which might otherwise be levied or imposed by the District. Nothing contained herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's right to levy assessments, including on the Property, in the event of a funding deficit.
- 3. **COLLECTION METHODS.** The District may enforce the collection of funds due under this Agreement using one or more of the following collection methods:
 - a. [Contractual Lien]. The District shall have the right to file a continuing lien ("Lien") upon all or a portion of the Property described in Exhibit B, which Lien shall be effective as of the date and time of the recording of a "Notice of Lien" in the public records of either Brevard or Volusia County.
 - b. [Enforcement Action] The District shall have the right to file an action against the Landowner in the appropriate judicial forum in and for either Brevard or Volusia County.
 - c. [Uniform Method; Direct] The District may certify amounts due hereunder as a non-ad valorem assessment on all or any part of the Property for collection, either through the Uniform Method of Collection set forth in Chapter 197, Florida Statutes, or under any method of direct bill and collection authorized by Florida law.

The enforcement of the collection of funds in any of the above manners, including which method(s) to utilize, shall be in the sole discretion of the District Manager on behalf of the District, without the need of further Board action authorizing or directing such.

4. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT; AMENDMENTS.** This instrument shall constitute the final and complete expression of the agreement among the Parties relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. Amendments to and waivers of the provisions contained in this Agreement may be made only by an instrument in writing which is executed by both of the Parties hereto.

- 5. **AUTHORIZATION.** The execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of all Parties hereto, each Party has complied with all of the requirements of law, and each Party has full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this instrument.
- 6. **ASSIGNMENT.** This Agreement may be assigned, in whole or in part, by either party only upon the written consent of the other. Any purported assignment without such consent shall be void.
- 7. **DEFAULT.** A default by either Party under this Agreement shall entitle the other to all remedies available at law or in equity, which shall include, but not be limited to, the right of damages, injunctive relief and/or specific performance.
- 8. **ENFORCEMENT.** In the event that any party is required to enforce this Agreement by court proceedings or otherwise, then the parties agree that the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other all costs incurred, including interest accrued on an unsatisfied Funding Obligation, reasonable fees and costs incurred by the District incident to the collection of the Funding Obligation or for enforcement of the Lien, or reasonable attorneys' fees and costs for trial, alternative dispute resolution, or appellate proceedings.
- 9. **THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES.** This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the formal Parties herein and no right or cause of action shall accrue upon or by reason hereof, to or for the benefit of any third party not a formal party hereto. Nothing in this Agreement expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to confer upon any person or corporation other than the Parties hereto any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Agreement or any provisions or conditions hereof; and all of the provisions, representations, covenants and conditions herein contained shall inure to the sole benefit of and shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and their respective representatives, successors and assigns.
- 10. **CHOICE OF LAW.** This Agreement and the provisions contained herein shall be construed, interpreted and controlled according to the laws of the State of Florida.
- 11. **ARM'S LENGTH.** This Agreement has been negotiated fully among the Parties as an arm's length transaction. The Parties participated fully in the preparation of this Agreement with the assistance of their respective counsel. In the case of a dispute concerning the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement, the Parties are each deemed to have drafted, chosen and selected the language, and the doubtful language will not be interpreted or construed against any Party.

RE: HB7013 - Special Districts Performance Measures and Standards

Reporting

To enhance accountability and transparency, new regulations were established for all special districts, by the Florida Legislature, during their 2024 legislative session. Starting on October 1, 2024, or by the end of the first full fiscal year after its creation (whichever comes later), each special district must establish goals and objectives for each program and activity, as well as develop performance measures and standards to assess the achievement of these goals and objectives. Additionally, by December 1 each year (initial report due on December 1, 2025), each special district is required to publish an annual report on its website, detailing the goals and objectives achieved, the performance measures and standards used, and any goals or objectives that were not achieved.

District Management has identified the following key categories to focus on for Fiscal Year 2025 and develop statutorily compliant goals for each:

- Community Communication and Engagement
- Infrastructure and Facilities Maintenance
- Financial Transparency and Accountability

Additionally, special districts must provide an annual reporting form to share with the public that reflects whether the goals & objectives were met for the year. District Management has streamlined these requirements into a single document that meets both the statutory requirements for goal/objective setting and annual reporting.

The proposed goals/objectives and the annual reporting form are attached as exhibit A to this memo. District Management recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt these goals and objectives to maintain compliance with HB7013 and further enhance their commitment to the accountability and transparency of the District.

<u>Project / Grant Update – August 8, 2024</u>

Edgewater Wetland Park Project

- **Objective:** Divert treated effluent from the City of Edgewater's WWTF from the Mosquito Lagoon to a constructed wetland west of Deering Park North, thus improving water quality in the lagoon.
- Estimated Total Cost: \$7,143,500
- **Grant:** DPSD received Indian River Water Quality Improvement Grant from FDEP for design and construction. No payment requests have been submitted to FDEP to date.
- Grant Ask/Award: \$7,143,500
- Status: Phillips & Jordan/Jacobs selected as design-build team on July 9, 2024. Project is on schedule, with design-build contract currently in process. We expect to present the contract to the DPSD Board at the September meeting.

Wetland Park Capacity Expansion Project (Reuse Tank and Booster Pump)

- **Objective:** Increase capacity to store and process more reclaimed water, preventing discharge to Mosquito Lagoon. If awarded, the project will be integrated into the Edgewater Wetland Park project.
- Estimated Total Cost: \$9,700,000
- **Grant:** FDEP Water Quality Improvement Grant program.
- Grant Ask/Award: \$9,700,000
- **Status:** Application submitted on behalf of DPSD on July 22. Awaiting award announcement in December 2024.

SR 442/I-95 Interchange Expansion and Resilience Project (Gateway to Edgewater)

- **Objective:** Expand SR 442 from 2 to 4 lanes under I-95, eliminate flooding, and support manufacturing/development in the area. This specific application addresses the flooding and drainage issues only, as a subset of the larger @ \$30,000,000 project.
- Estimated Total Cost: \$5,872,270
- **Grant:** FL Dept of Commerce Job Growth Grant Fund.
- Grant Ask/Award: \$4,742,270
- **Status:** Nearing completion of an application for stormwater improvements to address flooding and drainage issues. To be submitted by the City of Edgewater in August 2024.

Deering Park North Trail Project

- **Objective:** Construct a 5-mile segment of the multi-use trail through Deering Park North, starting at the existing trail south of SR 442, east of I-95, connecting under the I-95 overpass, passing by the future Edgewater Wetland Park, and extending north to SR 44 in New Smyrna Beach through the Deering Park North conservation area.
- Estimated Total Cost: \$8,362,113
- **Grant/Funding:** FL Dept of Transportation SUNTRAIL program.
- Grant Ask/Award: \$8,362,113
- Status: Request for Funding submitted by DPSD in December 2023, with correspondence occurring until March 2024. No further updates anticipated until Fall 2024. If selected, grant funds would be available after July 1, 2025.

Turnbull Hammock Nutrient Reduction Project

- **Objective:** Pilot project to reduce nutrients in stormwater before reaching the Indian River Lagoon, and assist the City of Edgewater in reducing their nutrient loads into the North Indian River Lagoon BMAP area.
- Goal: Reduce 121 lbs/year of Total Nitrogen (TN) and 32 lbs/year of Total Phosphorous (TP).
- Estimated Total Cost: \$1,520,000
- **Grant:** FDEP Water Quality Improvement Grant program.
- Grant Ask/Award: \$1,520,000
- **Status:** Application submitted on behalf of DPSD on July 31, 2024. Awaiting award announcement in December 2024.

Mr. Kantarzhi explained the RFQ process and explained that the Evaluation Committee Members will evaluate, score and rank the bid responses, individually or as a group, based on the evaluation criteria and ranking form and provide a recommendation to the CDD Board at the CDD meeting that will be held later today. The CDD Board can consider and accept the Committee's scores, ranking and recommendation or complete individual or evaluation criteria ranking forms or complete it as a group at the CDD meeting.

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- I. Phillips & Jordan, Inc. and Jacobs

46 **B. Evaluation Criteria**

- Aiding the Evaluation Committee Members in discussions to determine scoring for each respondent, as the Members chose to complete the evaluation criteria and ranking form as a group, Spokesperson Boyd pointed out the following differences in each response for each of the four categories:
- 51 Qualifications of Team
- Deemed both respondents and sub-contractors well-qualified to provide design-build services for the Edgewater Wetland Park Project.
- Phillips & Jordan has a fair amount of team members experienced in specific wetland parks throughout Florida.
- Wharton-Smith team members have experience in other similar types of projects but nothing specific to a wetland, as a reuse discharge park.
- Wharton-Smith team members' have a lot of local experience with Edgewater Utilities and are specific to the region but would utilize nine sub-consultants whereas Phillips & Jordan lists two firms; it possible Phillips & Jordan has in-house personnel to perform the work or they might utilize subcontractors but just did not list them.
 - Phillips & Jordan's response is exactly the same as the qualification criteria in the RFQ, making it easier to review each category, versus the format of the response from Wharton-Smith.
 - Collaborative Delivery Approach

- Deemed that both respondents have a strong project approach focused on the nature of
- 67 the project and both brought up potential issues that need to be addressed, like the variability
- 68 of reclaimed water flow.
- 69 Approach: Phillips & Jordan emphasized slightly more on what they would do with
- 70 respect to the wetland build park type project. Wharton-Smith took the same approach as for a
- 71 normal design-build project and applied it to this project, which they successfully demonstrated

- 73 Communication Plan: The Phillips & Jordan team is using an in-house person versus

- Ms. Cerbone suggested the Committee review the last paragraph, on Page 14 of Phillips
- 87 & Jordan bid package, as it might provide an answer to the subconsultant question.

- 89 Mr. Kantarzhi pointed out that neither respondent is certified as a Minority Business
- 90 Enterprise, which is a specific RFQ criteria; therefore, he recommended awarding zero points to

- 92 > It was noted that Wharton-Smith's subconsultant, Liquid Solutions Group, LLC (LSG), is a
- 93 certified Minority Business Enterprise and subconsultant, Eco-Build Strategies, is a certified
- 94 Woman-Owned Minority Business Enterprise. Ms. Cerbone recalled that the main respondent

must be certified as a Minority Business Enterprise to receive a score in that category. She will confirm this with District Counsel.

The Committee Members discussed scores for each respondent in each category.

Regarding the Minority Business Enterprise category, Mr. Johnson reviewed statute and stated that it does not require the Evaluation Committee to give credit because a subcontractor is a certified Minority Business Enterprise or preclude the Evaluation Committee from giving points. The Committee has the discretion to award some or all of the points to the discretion that the respondents both have subcontractors. It was noted that Phillips & Jordan did not disclose subcontractors in its bid. Mr. Johnson stated that, if either respondent did not provide evidence of being a certified Minority Business Enterprise, the cleanest approach would be to award each respondent zero points in that category.

Mr. Johnson read the definition of Minority Business Enterprise.

Discussion ensued and questions were raised as to whether a respondent's domicile is in Florida and if they are considered a small business, which resulted in awarding zero points for the category.

Regarding subconsultants, Ms. Cerbone advised the Committee that, if the RFQ did not require respondents to list subconsultants, then respondents who did not are not remiss or found to have minor variance in their response.

C. Ranking

Mr. Kantarzhi recapped the overall group scores and ranking, as follows:

He stated that, in advance of the Evaluation Committee presenting a recommendation to the Board to award the Design-Builder Services contract for the Edgewater Wetland Park Project, provided additional informational about the company. He discussed selecting a vested team consisting of local residents, current projects, relationships with local subconsultants and making financial contributions to the Minority and Woman-Owned Business Enterprise.

Mr. Walt Nickel of Wright-Pierce stated they were very instrumental in assembling the qualifications of a design team with multiple subconsultants because there are specialties needed for the project. He has personally worked with all the subconsultants on multiple projects throughout his career in Florida and pointed out that Wharton-Smith/Wright-Pierce presented solid ideas regarding erosion coming in and within the wetland cells, etc.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Responses to Statement of Qualifications: RFQ for Design-Builder for Edgewater Wetland Park Project

Mr. Kantarzhi distributed and presented a revised Agenda where, behind Item 3C, Resolution 2024-10 replaced the Competitive Selection Criteria form. The Evaluation Committee Meeting was held at 11:00 a.m. today. The Evaluation Committee Members are Mr. James Boyd, Mr. Robbie Lee and Mr. Chris Warshaw.

- I. Phillips & Jordan, Inc. and Jacobs
- II. Wharton-Smith, Inc. and Wright-Pierce

65 B. Evaluation Committee Ranking

Mr. Boyd, as an Evaluation Committee Member and the Committee Spokesperson, stated that the Committee was extremely pleased with both responses and believe that either team can do a really great job on this project. He discussed the process of evaluating each respondent's bid and the reasoning behind the scores for each respondent, in each category, which are based on the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) Competitive Selection Criteria.

Mr. Boyd recapped the Evaluation Committee's overall scores and rankings, as follows:

- 72 #1 Phillips & Jordan, Inc. 92 Points
- 73 #2 Wharton-Smith, Inc. 90 Points

Ms. Cerbone discussed the Board's options, which are to accept the Committee's scores, ranking and recommendation as its own, or complete individual or group ranking forms.

Mr. Storch voiced his opinion that the Evaluation Committee's scoring was close in determining that both respondents are very well qualified and that the Committee seemed to review the RFQ responses very thoroughly. He would like the Board to accept the scores and ranking of the Evaluation Committee as its own.

On MOTION by Mr. Storch and seconded by Mr. Fife, with all in favor, accepting the Evaluation Committee scores, ranking and recommendation to rank Phillips & Jordan, Inc., as the #1 ranked respondent to the Request for Qualifications for Design-Builder for the Edgewater Wetland Park Project, as its own, was approved.

C. Consideration of Resolution 2024-10, Adopting the Evaluation and Selecting Design-Build Firms' Statements of Qualifications for the Edgewater Wetland Park Project; Providing a Severability Clause; and Providing an Effective Date

Ms. Cerbone provided additional language to include with adopting Resolution 2024-10, which will allow District Counsel to proceed with negotiating an agreement and allow the Chair or Vice Chair to participate in the process. The Board will review the contract for approval and execution at the next meeting. Asked about the negotiation process, Mr. Johnson referred to Section 2 of the Resolution, which states, if negotiations with Phillips & Jordan fail, the District can terminate negotiations and undertake negotiations with Wharton-Smith, Inc., the #2 ranked respondent.

On MOTION by Mr. Posey and seconded by Mr. Fife, with all in favor, Resolution 2024-10, Adopting the Evaluation and Selecting Design-Build Firms' Statements of Qualifications for the Edgewater Wetland Park Project; Providing a Severability Clause; and Providing an Effective Date, was adopted, and the Board, by awarding Phillips & Jordan, Inc., 92 points and Wharton-Smith, Inc., 90 points, has determined that it is in the best interests of the District and its residents and landowners to name Phillips & Jordan, Inc., the most highly qualified firm for design-build services for the Project and authorizing District Counsel to proceed with negotiating an agreement and for the Chair or Vice Chair to participate in the process was approved.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Presentation of Audited Annual Financial Report for the Fiscal Year Ended September 30, 2023, Prepared by Berger, Toombs, Elam, Gaines & Frank

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Mr. Kantarzhi presented the Audited Annual Financial Report for the Fiscal Year Ended September 30, 2023 and noted the pertinent information. It was a clean audit; there were no findings, recommendations, deficiencies on internal control or instances of non-compliance.

Asked why the District always has a negative balance, Ms. Cerbone stated that it is typically due to the timing between billing and the receipt of funds. From a legal standpoint, Mr. Johnson stated that it does not prompt a need to take action.

He noted that every trail, road, bridge and resurfacing project in the entire State goes through the exact same process.

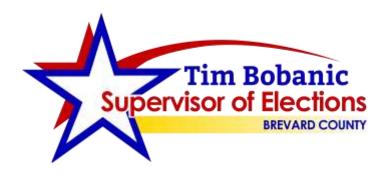
